Have you noticed that with each passing year, stores are preparing for the Christmas season earlier and earlier? They used to wait until after Thanksgiving; then it was moved up to right after Halloween. I do my best to stay as far away from malls as possible, but I was told by a certain unnamed shopping expert in my family that this year some stores even began Christmas promotions in October! Depending on the store, they can anticipate from 20 to 80% of their yearly sales during this period. Merchants look forward to Christmas with great anticipation.

Children also eagerly anticipate Christmas morning. The inevitable travel question "are we there yet?" has become a calendar question: "how many more days until Christmas?" Children look forward to Christmas with great anticipation.

Are we anticipating Christmas? What would it take for your heart -- for my heart -- to be filled with anticipation this Christmas? Anticipation -- not for all the hoopla -- but to rediscover the true meaning of Christmas for our lives?

Oswald Chambers points us in the right direction with these thoughts: "Jesus Christ reveals, not an embarrassed God, not a confused God, not a God who stands apart from problems, but the One who stands in the thick of the whole thing with men and women."

The Apostle John writes, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us." (John 1:1, 14)

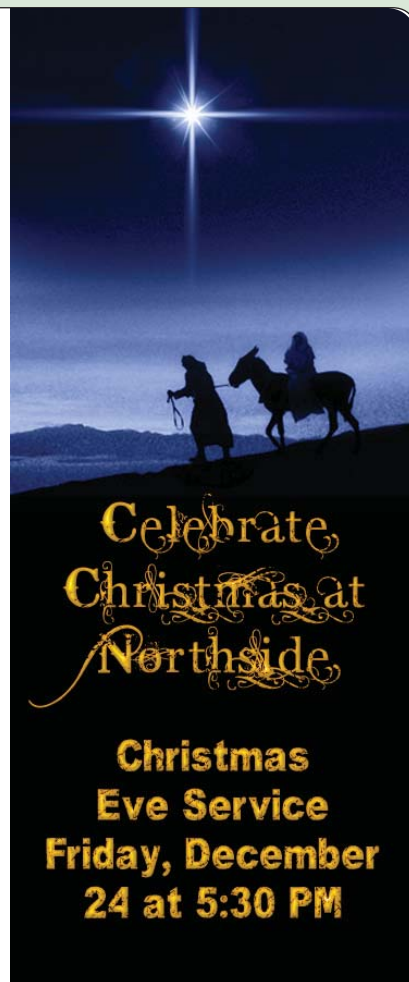
In the December 1997 issue of Decision magazine, Susan Noland wrote a powerful article on keeping the proper perspective in Christmas. She told of setting out her nativity scene, carefully placing all the figures in their "proper" place -- the wise men close to the manger; the shepherds in the background behind them.

Her 3-year old daughter Caroline took it upon herself to rearrange the nativity scene -- she placed the baby Jesus in the center and put everyone else in a circle surrounding Him. When Susan asked Caroline why she had rearranged the figures, Caroline answered, "so they can all see the baby good."

Susan writes: "In all my arranging for the holidays, in my attempts to create a sense of aesthetic pageantry and symmetry for the Christmas season in my home, I had missed the point. The reason for that night in Bethlehem was so that everyone could see the baby. Our heavenly Father was offering kings and commoners alike the opportunity of a lifetime."

On a cold Bethlehem evening some 2,000 years ago, God stepped out of heaven into our world in the person of Jesus Christ. He is "Immanuel -- God with us!" He came to show how much He loves us and cares for us. May you find some time during this holiday season to spend a few moments with the One who stands with you. It is so easy to get caught up in preparing to celebrate Christmas that we neglect meaningful celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Take time this season to think, to wonder, to pray, and to give thanks.

In the days ahead, may Christ's deep affection and care become more and more real for you and may you sense how special you are to Him!



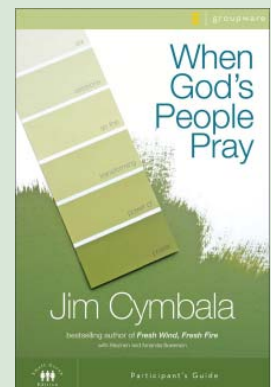

Our JOY Luncheon in September centered around several Biblical sea adventures. Five tables represented five islands on which the group rotated and did sea activities that helped build a stronger relationship with God. On the tables were decorations of blue waters, parted walls of water, fish nets, many fish, dolphins, coral reefs, conch shells, star fish, sea fans and sailing boats.

1. Isle of Belief (Exodus 14:16) On this island we experienced what the Israelites might have felt as they walked between the high walls of

parted waters. With fishing poles, we caught fish with Bible verses printed on the back. Each scripture reinforced our belief in God.

2. Isle of Hope (Acts 27) This island relationship with God took us on Paul's stormy, shipwrecked journey to Rome. The adventurous story from Acts was read while we followed the journey going from port to port piecing together map puzzle pieces of his 1,500 mile trip.
3. Isle of Obedience – Our memories were refreshed with the reason behind Jonah being in the belly of a big fish. This story of obedience to God unfolded as we dug into large conch shells that held detailed story questions and then we dug out answers in smaller sea shells.
4. Isle of Trust (Matthew 8: 23-27 – Jesus Calms the Sea and Matthew 14:22-34 Jesus Walks on Water

toward Peter) On this island we dived into blue shredded foil waters for underwater scriptures that helped us build our relationship in trusting God.

5. Isle of Sharing God's Love – The most wonderful relationship we can have with God is sharing His word. Jesus said to Simon, "Don't Be Afraid. From now on you will catch men." So Simon pulled the boats up on shore, left everything behind and followed Jesus."

In October, our group went on a guided tour of the State House in downtown Indianapolis and then journeyed north to The Journey restaurant for lunch. In November, get ready for a Harvest Dinner Feast. Following the meal, we'll have some fun after-dinner games to help work off some of those calories.
